CLASS NEWS

This week we wrote non-chronological reports about the aliens we created last week. As mathematicians, we found 1 more and 1 less, and developed an understanding of how consecutive numbers have a difference of 1. We also spent lots of time practising for our performance which is next Thursday at 2pm. Please ensure your child knows their lines and the line before theirs so they know when to speak. Also, please make sure their costumes are in school on Monday.

Year 2 learnt about non-chronological reports this week as authors. In maths, we compared volume and capacity and explored Concordes as historians. Please read with your child <u>5 times a week</u>. Use Bug Club - ask your teacher if you have forgotten your login. Practise your 2, 5 and 10 times tables including doing them out of order.

SEAR 3 This week, as author writers we wrote a narrative to retell the Roman diary from another perspective. In enquiry, we planned our sentences for the podcast that we will be making next week. In maths, we continued to look at fractions. Please read with your child at least 3 times a week and ask them questions about their reading. Please complete the homework sheet.

As engineers, Year 4 designed and created their own musical instruments out of cardboard and elastic bands. We will be playing and evaluating them next week too. We had an exciting trip to the Bristol Beacon to watch the Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra and the children were so sensible on the walk there and back. At home, put each spelling word into a sentence that makes sense in your homework book. Please read with your child at least 3 times a week. Practise your 9 times tables including division facts and doing them out of order.

In maths this week, we calculated the volume of cuboids as well as learning about cube numbers. As authors, we explored, planned and began writing an explanation text about how chocolate is made. In enquiry, we learnt about thermal conductors and insulators. At home, ask your child to explain how chocolate is made.

Year 6 were busy creating magnificent Greek theatre masks using clay. They also wrote exciting newspaper reports about mighty Odysseus slaying Penelope's suitors. At home, practise SATs style questions.


