On Wednesday 24th January Year 1 took part in an Energy Saving Workshop. This was run by Mitsubishi and JCW Energy Services. We enjoyed finding out about different ways we could save energy at home and at school. We carried out experiments and made posters to encourage others to save energy in the future.

Sunflower children had another fun session at Horseworld this week.

They gave the horses a good brush and also learned how to use 'Long Reins' to get them ready to ride the horses next week!







A very big well done to all of the Year 4's who put on a brilliant performance of 'Snow White'. We hope parents and carers enjoyed it as much as we did. They all worked extremely hard over to make sure it was spot on.... and it was!

The Green Team visited 'Grow Bristol' to see an actual Urban Farm.

They learned a bit about how food gets to our tables and how long it can take to travel (unless we buy locally produced, seasonal vegetables).

So, now they know all about sustainable farming!



What have we been learning?

Reception....we created our own superheroes!
We thought about what super powers they
have, what costumes they wear, what super
tools they use and what their superhero name
is. We created our own superhero stories with
a problem and a solution. When you go
shopping, ask your child how much things
cost. Talk about different coins and how much
they are worth.

Year 1... In Literacy we crested our own stories. In Numeracy we searched for missing numbers in a number sentence/number frame. We enjoyed special circle time activities, where we talked about our families and what makes a special friend. We also enjoyed learning about food chains and taking part in an Energy Saving Workshop. At home, ask your child to how to help save energy around the house.

Year 2...This week we learnt about healthy eating. We made a couscous salad and learned how to use a knife safely. In maths, we learnt how to find fractions of numbers. In literacy we made changes to our class story. At home, please try and tell stories with your child that start with a wish that comes true.

Year 3... this week we wrote our own stories, inspired by our class text 'Charlie and the Chocolate Factory'. In Maths we focused on dividing with remainders and looking at scaling. Excitingly, we have also begun practising for our performance! At home, please talk to your child about our performance and help them learn their lines if they have a speaking role.

Year 4... made us all really proud with their amazing performance of Snow White! They worked really hard to learn their lines, get in role and be really clear when acting. They enjoyed performing for the school and their families. We finished the week with a workshop on the digestive system and how our food is digested At home, please help your child to practise their weekly spellings. (Parents - come to our spelling workshop on 7 February where you can get lots of ideas about how to help your child!)

Year 5... In maths we learned how to do short division and how to apply our division knowledge to solve word problems. In English we learned about using tenses accurately and wrote an informal letter from a son to his mum based on 'The Viewer', the mystery story we are reading this term. At home, please ask your child questions about what they read each day.

Year 6... What a busy week in year 6! In maths, our week started with explaining what fractions are before moving on to finding percentages of amounts. In English, we wrote instruction texts about how to catch a fish, thinking about how we were commanding the reader. We also thought about our precision in reading. In topic, we learned about the lungs and how they work when we breathe in. At home, please make sure your child is recording their reading in their green record.
