





What have we been learning?

Year 1

In numeracy we have been ordering numbers and making numbers with tens and ones. We also enjoyed creating firework art, ready for the special Bonfire Night! We have enjoyed special circle time sessions, where we have been talking about how we can be kind and caring friends to one another. *At home, please read with your child every day for 15 minutes, and ask questions about the characters and story.*

Year 3

This week has been Anti-bullying week and Year 3 have been thinking about what makes them unique! In English, they have written their very own magic box poems and in Maths children have begun to use the column method to add three digit numbers.

At home, please help your child to practise column addition.

Year 5

In Maths this week we have been learning how to read and draw line graphs. In English, we have been writing and performing poetry. *At home, please help your child to find examples of line graphs and timetables in real life.*

Year 2

This week we have been learning to add two 2 digit numbers. In literacy we have enjoyed learning the poem 'The Owl and the Pussycat'. In topic we watched a brilliant puppet show about Rama and Sita. *Please make sure that your child learns this week's spellings ready for the test on Monday.*

Year 4

This week Year 4 acted out scenes which represented our anti-bullying motto 'all different, all equal'. In English, they wrote their own Haiku, Tanka and Cinquain poems and in Maths they learned how to exchange when using the column method for addition and subtraction. *At home, please support your child to practise the column method for addition and subtraction.*

Year 6

In maths, we learned about multiples, factors and prime numbers and improved our reasoning skills. We started a new book in English called Skellig and made predictions from different versions of the cover and then went to the school basement to read chapter 1! It's been anti-bullying week and we carried out a science investigation, making links to being all different and all equal. *Help at home by asking your child about the mental methods we have learnt this week!*
