What have we learnt this week?

Reception classes ... This week we enjoyed learning the story 'We're going on a bear hunt'. Ladybirds had a great first week with Miss Wilkinson and Caterpillars enjoyed a very exciting dance workshop. We worked hard on learning our new sounds - p i n - and using the words 'more' 'fewer' and 'less' in maths. You can help at home by asking your child to count groups of objects and say e.g. Do we have more/ less bananas or apples?

Year 1 ... This week we found a mysterious dinosaur nest in our playground! We looked through non-fiction books to find out more about dinosaurs and guess what kind of dinosaur could be in the egg! In numeracy we ordered numbers and made numbers with tens and ones. We also enjoyed a visit from the fire brigade, where we learnt how to keep safe in the event of a fire. At home, please read with your child every day for 15 minutes, and ask questions about the characters and story. Practice counting in 2s,5s and 10s.

Year 2... We have had a good week! We learnt about the inverse in Numeracy. This means we now know that subtraction is the opposite of addition. In Literacy we learnt all about instruction texts. At home please help your child to practise their x2, x5 and x10 tables.

Year 3 ... This week we practised multiplication, using our 3, 4 and 8 times tables. We made up actions for our new class text: 'The Diary of a Wimpy Kid', and learned lots about how we can stop bullying. At home, please practise the 3, 4 and 8 times tables with your child.

Year 4 ... This week we found gigantic green lily pads on our balcony! We interviewed Mr Webster about the event and he explained that he saw frogs covering the sky late on Tuesday night! In maths, we learned about factors and identified factor pairs. We enjoyed singing 'Bizwaz the Bee' to learn our six times table! At home, please Discuss 'Flying Frog Frenzy' with your child at home – can they retell you the story?

Year 5... Year 5 have had another busy week! In Literacy we learned the different features of a biography and in Maths we revised times table facts and learned how to work out square and cube numbers. Year 5 worked extremely well in their Anti-Bullying lessons this week and wrote poems describing 'power for good'. At home please support your child to practise their mental maths skills.

Year 6 ... In literacy this week, we recapped the features of a persuasive text and learnt about how to use semi-colons. In maths, we learnt about prime and composite numbers after reminding ourselves about what factors and multiples are. On Thursday, we went swimming at Easton Leisure centre. We also produced an anti-bullying drama showing the 'power of good'. At home, please ask your child for examples of prime and composite numbers and what they are.
