

# This week's learning ...

**Reception classes** ... This week we learnt about how different people celebrate Eid. We learnt about different cultures and tradition, and the different types of celebrations that happen around the world. **Please help at home by practising the sounds and words we have learnt this year.** 

- Year 1 ... This week was a fun week for everyone in Gruffalo class. We developed our measuring and cooking skills by making our very own pasta salad! At home, please read with your child every night, and ask them questions about the story. Please also talk about measurement in different places; like cooking and when shopping.
- Year 2... This week Year 2 learned about different special times. We acted out the story 'The Magic Brush' and worked on our mental maths skills. Please ask your child to tell you about Isambard Kingdom Brunel. This will help with your homework.
- **Year 3** ... This week we created an Egyptian landscape with watercolours, wrote instructions on mummification and carried out an investigation using Egyptian numbers. **At home, please read with your child and make sure they are answering a range of questions.**
- **Year 4** ... We used our noticing skills and measuring skills to create precise geometrical patterns. We learnt about Archimedes, an Ancient Greek mathematician and we experimented with placing objects in water to measure capacity. We continued to study Greek myths in Literacy. We also created some art using finger painting to represent friendship, hope, peace, and nature. **You can help at home by asking your child to re-tell a Greek myth to you.**
- **Year 5...** In maths this week, we completed an assessment of our learning from the year and we learnt about Roman numerals. In literacy, we learnt about modal verbs and when they are used in stories. We enjoyed our topic lessons this week where we looked at the regeneration of the Bristol Docks and then produced a TV advert persuading people to come and visit our city. Keep your eye on our class blogs to see these. **At home, please ask your child about the changes that have happened to the harbour and the positives they bring to the people who live in Bristol.**
- **Year 6** ... This week we enjoyed an open top bus tour around Bristol! Thank you to our business friends Deloitte who funded this trip and sent some volunteers along too. We learnt lots of new information about the history behind some of Bristol's important landmarks. Year 6 have created some Islamic Art designs during the Eid celebration days and ended the week with an Eid party! **Please help at home by encouraging children to practise their lines for the leavers' performance and help them to put together a costume to fit their role.**
