What have we been learning?


Reception... We have been learning how to make bread. We ground corn to make flour and we also kneaded out our own dough.



In Maths, we learnt to halve numbers. **At home, you could practise halving things with child. You could try with groups of toys or fruit - or even water!**

Year 1... In Literacy this week, we wrote information texts to explain 'How to catch a giant'. We also started to learn the songs linked to our performance - 'The Litter Muncher'. We had lots of fun visiting Waterstones, where we exchanged our World Book Day voucher for a special book. **At home please talk to your child about our performance, and keep reading with your child and asking them questions about the text.**

Year 2... This week we learnt how to write an information text. We also wrote reports about nocturnal animals. In Maths, we learnt how to read scales and describe different measures. **At home, please help your child to learn to tell the time.**



Year 3... We've been very busy this week in Year Three. We went on a trip to Bristol zoo, where we learnt lots more about rainforest animals to help with our topic. In English, we wrote reports on some very interesting animals and in Maths we worked hard on comparing and converting lengths! **At home, please help your child to practise their 10x tables.**



Year 4... In English this week, we wrote a newspaper report about a missing pirate in 'The Pirate Cruncher' story. In Maths, children understood the link between fractions and decimals, focusing on tenths and hundredths. In topic, we did a science experiment on different types of water states. **At home, please discuss different uses of water in people's jobs such as farmers.**



Year 5... In topic this week we researched a part of the solar system, and showed our learning by writing monologues as our chosen research topic.



At home, help your child to work on instant recall of times tables and division facts.

Year 6... This week Kestrel class were at Into University learning all about Evolution & Inheritance, visiting Bristol Zoo and even graduating at Bristol University! Eagle class calculated area and volume of shapes this week and everyone wrote and published newspaper articles about missing Darkling Beetle. **At home, ask your children to calculate the perimeter, area and volume of objects around the home.**
