Be Safe - Show Respect - Engage

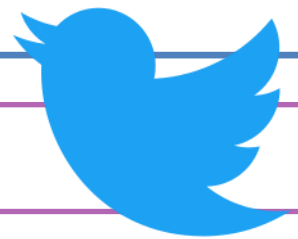
Make sure you talk with your children about the messages behind these rules.

What have been learning?

Year 1

Year 1 have had a busy week: We learnt the story Goldilocks and the Three Bears and we created patterns in maths. We also learnt about class routines and created a class charter with a set of rules. Please ensure children complete this week's homework ready to hand in on Monday.

Year 2

We have done some fantastic learning this week! In maths, we learnt about place and ordered and compared numbers. In English, we started to learn the story of Kassim and the Greedy Dragon and practised using adjectives in our writing. This term our topic is The Great Fire of London and we began by locating countries and asking questions about the fire. Please make sure your child remembers to bring their book bag everyday!

Year 4

This week Year 4 experienced a shocking event taking place this week – flying frogs around our school! They read and learned a newspaper report about this event. In maths, Year 4 created different 2 digit and 3 digit numbers using maths equipment. At home, please support your child to read and write 2, 3, 4 digit numbers.

Year 3

This week we revised some Year 2 maths learning to get ready for new Year 3 maths! In English, we learnt to use fronted adverbials and description, as well as learning the story of Ug the Hunter! Children learnt about our first topic: Prehistoric Britain! At home, ask your child what they learned about the Stone Age and research more information.

Year 5

This week in Year 5 we wrote Kennings Poems, learnt how to decode Roman Numerals and started to look at our new text: The Saga of Biorn. We also went to our first swimming session – so we have had a busy week! Practice your 3, 6 and 12 times tables. See if you can say them in any order! Encourage your child to read all different forms of word at home, and complete your homework.

Year 6

Some children have been in Exmouth on camp this week, having a lovely time learning circus skills, enjoying water sports, and enjoying the sunshine after a windy start! The other Year 6 children made artistic tiles, worked out codes to maths investigations, pretended to be news reporters, had fun playing at Chelsea park, and even met the manager of Ibis hotels to practise their French! At home, ask your child what they know so far about the book The Wolf Wilder!
