CLASS NEWS

LAVENDER This week as mathematicians we continued learning about time. As writers, we created sentences about how summer is different to winter, making sure to include the word 'because' to explain why. We also enjoyed some sensory play, exploring how shaving foam feels! At home, practise telling the time and remind your child their are five minutes between each number on the clock - counting by fives will help them work it out!

RECEPTION Reception thought about all they learnt this year and looked forward to what they will learn in Year 1. We discussed things that we are good at and what we want to practise. In maths we learnt about doubling. We enjoyed a lovely performance 'When the birds sang' by the Travelling Light theatre company too. At home, please read your book - practise your story voice!

YEAR Well done Year 1 for completing your phonics screening checks. You have worked so hard!! Parents will be told if their child has passed the test towards the end of term. This week in maths, children learnt to find quarters. In English, children learnt to use the power of three (three adjectives in a row). At home, talk to your child about finding quarter of a shape and a number. Please read with your child every night.

YEAR 2 What a brilliant week in Year 2. The children learnt about position and movement in maths. We also wrote recounts and diary entries. We also enjoyed learning about Victorian schools and thinking about life in the olden days. At home, please test your child on telling the time. Please read with your child 5 times a week, and learn the 2 and 5 times table facts out of order.

This week Year 3 saved the rainforest by writing persuasive texts to help stop deforestation. They also continued their work on time, looking at seconds and minutes. As geographers they studied climates zones and biomes. Please read with your child 5 times a week. Learn the 3, 4 and 8 times table facts out of order. Practise joined handwriting at home.


This week we began studying money as mathematicians, comparing and ordering amounts using decimal notation. As authors, we wrote short stories using expanded sentences, while as readers we read short stories and interpreted moral messages from them. In our enquiry, we investigated melting, freezing, evaporating and condensation. At home, read stories with your child and find moral messages.

This week Year 5 added and subtracted decimals, wrote character descriptions using expanded noun phrases as authors, and learnt more about lifecycles of different types of animals. At home, keep encouraging your child to read at home.

YEAR 6 We had an exciting week on Year 6 - a visit from Travelling Light for a drama workshop, swimming, a class treat and IntoUniversity! We also did some excellent letter writing to our MP Thangam Debonnaire about plastic pollution. At home, keep encouraging your child to read.




