Reception

This week we practised our story 'The Gingerbread Man' with actions. We thought about different ways he could have crossed the river. We designed and made boats using different materials and tested them out. As mathematicians we have been naming, describing and making pictures with 2D shapes Look out for circles, squares, triangles and rectangles around your home or when out walking. Take photos and add them to your child's Interactive Learning Diary. (ILD)



This week as mathematicians we learnt how to divide 2 digit numbers and the children were amazing! We also produced some fantastic writing. We had a busy week being actors in Enquiry and English. We loved learning all about parables in the bible on RE day and acting them out! At home, please practise dividing using the 3s, 4s, 6s and 8



We learnt to find equivalent fractions as mathematicians and will start to use fractions more next week. As authors, we practised 'show not tell' to develop characters in a story. Our enquiry this week focused on the forces on earth, we investigated water resistance and thought about gravity. Our art this term is focussing on Vincent Van Gogh

At home, talk about the characters in the book we are reading. Ask your child: Who are the main characters? What are they



This week as mathematicians we learnt to count numbers mentally. As writers we began to write our story 'The Last Tree'. As Geographers we explored Atlases and learnt about the continents of the world. Ask your child to tell you about it! At home, please read every day. Practise number bonds within twenty. For example: 2 + 7 = 10, 4 + 16 = 20, 3 + 2 = 5, 6 + 4 = 10

Year 2

This week as mathematicians we learnt about fractions of shapes and amounts, focusing on halves, quarters and thirds. As scientists we tested materials and observed their properties. As writers we planned a persuasive advert to sell 'Traction Man'. Ask your child to tell you about it! At home, please read with your child. Practise your multiplication tables on Times Tables Rockstars. Make sure to practise your spellings at home for the test!

It has been a busy week for Year 4. Swift had their first Ukulele lesson and learnt some new songs. Both classes welcomed back the artists from Merkal Studios and began practising their sculpting skills. We also began rehearsal for our performance.. only 4 weeks to go until the big show! At home, Practice multiplying and dividing by 11 and 12



This week as Scientists we discovered how shadows are affected by transparent, translucent and opaque liquids. As Authors we wrote newspaper articles about a main event in Wolf Wilder. We are now experts at converting fractions to decimals as mathematicians! At home, ask children how to convert a fraction to a decimal! $E.g. \frac{7}{10} = ?$ 5/6 = ?
