Attendance



This week we began our new enquiry 'What goes on behind the scenes'. We listened to and made music which sounds like the sea, created collages using patterned/textured paper we made, and learnt 2 songs for our performance at the end of term. We can't wait for you to see it! We also wrote our own stories about a boy who gets stuck on the moon, and as mathematicians we learnt to add and subtract numbers. It has been a lovely, busy first week back. Please read with your child every day and ensure they know how to read and spell the tricky words sent home last term.

This week we read our new story 'Zeraffa Giraffa'. We enjoyed predicting what the story might be about using clues before reading the story together. In maths we learnt our 5 and 10 times tables. In history, we learnt about different modes of transport. Please read with your child ever day. Practise your 2, 5 and 10 times tables, including doing them out of order.

This week we focused on our measurements in maths, converting m, cm and mm. We looked at how we can add and subtract lengths. In author writers, we read lots of books and saw what life was like as a gladiator. We were geographers this week by locating places where Romans settled on a map. Please read with your child at least 3 times a week and ask them questions about their reading. Please complete the homework sheet.

As authors, Year 4 enjoyed a week of exploring, performing and adapting a variety of animal poems by Ted Hughes. We looked carefully at the features of a good rhyming poem. Towards the end of the week, they even published and performed their own rhyming animal poetry. As mathematicians, we continued to work hard on ordering fractions. As scientists, we did experiments to launch our new topic 'What is the difference between noise and sound?'. At home, put each spelling word into a sentence that makes sense in your homework book. Please read with your child at least 3 times a week. Practise your 7 times tables including division facts and doing them out of order.

As mathematicians, we continued our work multiplying whole numbers by decimals. In our authors work we learnt to use simile, metaphor and personification in our story writing, while as historians we studied the Mayan empire and their invention of the world's greatest resource: chocolate! At home, ensure your child reads for 18 minutes, three times a week. We're benchmarking soon and hope - with good practice - to be able to increase your child's bookband.

Year 6 had a fantastic first week back this term. We began by investigating various Greek myths - including the tale of Odysseus, which we are using to support our writing. As mathematicians we learnt about multiplying and dividing decimals. At home, help your child read 3 times for 18 minutes each week.
