What an end to the week with Bristol Reggae orchestra playing to celebrate the 75th anniversary of Windrush. There was a real buzz around the school today as all the equipment started to turn up and the hall was transformed into a performance space. The children were excited to see so many adults and see and hear instruments being played live. The Windrush represents a group of people who moved to Britain bringing with them their culture and traditions. This is the foundation on which the Hannah More community is built. Every week we welcome new students who have come with their families from another country to start a new life. CLASS NEWS

LAVENDER As mathematicians we continued learning about time. We practised telling the exact time past the hour. As writers we practised writing sentences including adjectives, verbs and adverbs of times such as yesterday, last week, tomorrow etc. At home, talk to your child about the time on the clock, looking at o'clock and the exact minutes past the hour e.g. 2 minutes past, 8 minutes past, 27 minutes past. Please take time to talk with your child about their interests and enjoy time together.

RECEPTION This week we enjoyed our new story 'Rosie's Walk' and did lots of map drawing and story writing in busy time! In maths we practised using 10 frames to show amounts to 10, and solved number problems. At home, help your child draw a map of your journey to school. What do you see on the way? Which way do you turn? Can you use the words turn left, right, go straight etc.

YEAR This week Year 1 learnt how to classify different animals based on their characteristics. They also learnt about the different types of diets animals have. In maths, children learnt about the different coins we use as money, and also learnt how to measure with a ruler. At home, talk to your child about different coins we use when we buy things. Read with your child every day.

TERR Z This week the children learnt about turning clockwise or anticlockwise and giving directions. We wrote our own stories about Anna Hibiscus and compared Bristol with Lagos for our enquiry lessons. At home, please test your child on telling the time. Please read with your child 5 times a week, and learn the 2 and 5 times table facts out of order.

SEAR 3 This week Year 3 had an exciting school trip to the Bristol Downs! We learnt about the goats that live in Bristol which surprised us and we went on a wildflower hunt. At school, we also made rainforest poetry, studied angles in maths and looked at parts of a plant as scientists. Please read with your child 5 times a week. Learn the 3, 4 and 8 times table facts out of order. Practise joined handwriting at home.

As mathematicians we explored shape, recognising the properties of different angles and triangles. We wrote stories with a moral message as authors. In our enquiry, we learnt about the features of rivers, as well as conducting an experiment with evaporation and condensation. At home, take your child out to explore rivers in the local area, see what features they can identify.

TEARS 5 As authors, children wrote fantastic poems about Varmints. They thought creatively about how the mood shifts in the book and linked this to their poems. At home, keep encouraging your child to read at home.

YEAR 6 Year 6 had a busy week with lots of writing - a non-chronological report about dragons AND a creepy narrative about a little girl who gets trapped in the body of a doll... At home, help your child practise their lines for the performance. Bake Sale Tuesday 27th June 3.15 after school
