connectives and conjunctions. In maths we continued to learn about how to tell the time to o'clock, quarter past, half past and quarter to. At home please practise your handwriting and spelling using the sheets that have been sent home.

Reception Reception carefully observed our caterpillars this week, they are growing very quickly! We did some amazing drawings of 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' story in drawing club. In maths we learnt all about doubles. Watch the number blocks episode 'Double Trouble' and practise doubling objects

This week we wrote non-chronological reports about snails and whales **F C A K I** to show off all our science learning and knowledge. In maths we began learning about time and made our own clocks. In enquiry we explored the different diets animals have! Please read with your child 5 times a week. Learn to count in 2s, 5s and 10s.

This week we continued to tell the time in maths. In our enquiry 'How are schools the same?' we went on a local walk around Hannah More and spotted geographical features. We then compared these with the features around Palm Avenue in Lagos. Test your child on the time. Please read with your child 5 times a week. Learn the 2 and 5 times table facts out of order.

Year 3 learnt all about deforestation and the harm it causes on plants, I EAR S animals and the environment. They performed their own persuasive speech on the problem and how everyone can make a difference and then wrote a persuasive text on the topic. We edited and published our fantastic pieces of writing. As mathematicians we began measuring mass in grams and kilograms. Please help your child learn the 3, 4 and 8 times tables. Please continue to encourage your child to read every day in a fluent voice.

Year 4 completed their Multiplication Table Check this week and showed off their learning this year. As mathematicians they began studying angles. In enquiry they learnt about rivers, creating posters to inform others. As authors they planned and began writing stories based on 'Song of the Dolphin Boy'. At home, please practise multiplication tables with your child while ensuring they are confident with their written addition, subtraction and multiplication methods.

Year 5 had an exciting week. We began our transition for Year 6 by doing some of our learning in our new class groups and showed some fabulous collaboration and team work! Please make sure your child reads for 15 minutes a day and practises their multiplication tables daily.

Year 6 wrote fantastic setting and character descriptions this week. As artists they painted the backgrounds to their final pieces which are inspired by Shinique Smith and we also began practising our end of year performance. At home please make sure your child knows the songs and their lines for the performance.
