(please note that parents will need to stay with their child for the first few sessions)

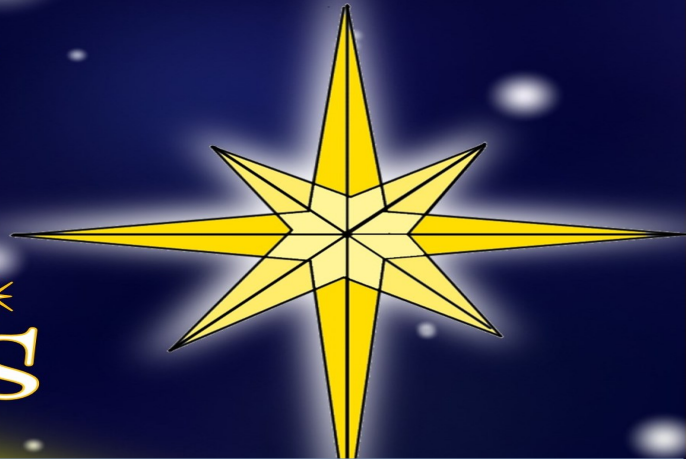

What have we been learning?

Year 1

This week Year 1 have created dinosaurs out of junk modelling! We also learnt how to take away, mentally and using manipulatives, and are now challenging ourselves to solve missing number sentences. We have learnt about the local area and thought about different features. We enjoyed going to Play space where we took part in the play for life challenge. *Please read with your child at home. Try logging on to bug club where children have been allocated lots of new books to read!*



Year 2

In maths we counted and added coins. In English we wrote a set of instructions on 'How to Make a Monster'. In Topic we have been creating maps and learning about an Indian village called Chembakolli. *You can help at home by researching information about India to share with the class.*



Year 4

This week we learn about different classifications of animals. We worked on our fantasy story 'Leon and the Place Between' and also solved lots of maths problems using our 6 times tables. *At home, please support your child to practise the 9 times table.*



Year 3

This week we learned to divide by sharing and grouping, including through tallies, arrays and number lines. In English, we looked again at complex sentences and began writing our innovated recounts. *At home, please help your child to practise three, four and eight times table multiplication & division facts.*



Year 5

This week we explored a biography of a scientist named Flint Lockwood. In topic, we experimented with the force of gravity by dropping objects with different masses to check their gravitational pull. In Maths, we looked at factors and multiplying in powers of ten. *At home, ask your child what they have learned about Flint Lockwood.*

Year 6

This week we used fractions in lots of different ways and lots of different calculations. We have been letter writing in English and using our best persuasive language. In topic this week, we learnt about the process of how chocolate is made. We've been getting cravings! *At home, please read our class blog and make a comment together!*
