CLASS NEWS

RECEPTION This week we drew maps like in our story 'Rosie's walk'. We also learnt about Eid and made Eid cards. In maths, we reviewed 2D shapes and practised estimating and counting objects to 20. **At home**, if you celebrated Eid, please add a photo to Tapestry if you can! Look for shapes e.g. triangles, circles, squares around your home. Can you say how many sides and corners they have? Please practise the tricky words on your keyring and bring your book bag to school every day!

YEAR 1 This week we wrote our own adventure stories! In maths, we practised measuring with a ruler. We also learnt about Eid al-Adha and why the festival is important to Muslims. **At home**, use a ruler or measuring tape to measure different items around the house. Please read with your child every night.

YEAR 2 This week Year 2 had a busy week completing lots of maths challenges and publishing some of their best writing. We enjoyed learning about Eid and finding out what makes it special. **At home**, please test your child on telling the time. Please read with your child 5 times a week, and learn the 2 and 5 times table facts out of order.

YEAR 3 This week Year 3 had a terrific bake sale for the rainforest where they raised £150, well done! They also did two exciting workshops - one with IntoUniversity to learn about future jobs they might have, and another from Turner and Townsend where they did an exciting 'egg drop'! Please read with your child 5 times a week. Learn the 3, 4 and 8 times table facts out of order. Practise joined handwriting at home.

YEAR 4 It's been a varied week! At the start of the week we learnt about angles and triangles in maths, while as authors we edited and published stories. Later in the week, while many were away for Eid, we engaged in art, cooking, quizzes and wide games out on the field. **At home**, ask your child to tell you the stories they've written, full of detail and description.

YEAR 5 Year 5 had a fantastic day with their School Linking classes from Bishop Henderson Primary School in Radstock. The children did lots of activities and played together and made new friends. While many children were off school celebrating Eid, those in school researched and created informative posters about different animals. **At home**, keep encouraging your child to read at home.

YEAR 6 Another busy week in Year 6! We began thinking about life after Hannah More and what our future careers could be. We had a careers fair with guests from many different professions - engineers, accountants, police officers, documentary producers and so many more! We also got to visit Socius offices and have a go at designing our own towns. **At home**, help your child practise for the performance.
