The gingerbread man continued his travels to faraway places. We have been busy writing messages and postcards back to him. We also started our new story 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears' and made our own porridge. As mathematicians we learnt that numbers are made up of parts and we learnt the numbers that are pairs to make 5. Can you remember the ingredients for porridge? Can you make some at home? This week we have been amazing mathematicians as we have continued our work on fractions. As authors we have written our own quest stories and as historians we have learnt all about Anglo-Saxon and Viking place names. At home, please practise dividing, using the 3, 4 and 8 times tables.

### Year 5

We began to add fractions this week and the children became very good at finding common denominators. We moved on to our non-fiction work in English lessons and now know the features of a non-chronological report - ready to write our own next week. We learn about gravity and the moon in our Enquiry lessons as we continue to answer our question: What makes our planet unique? At home, ask your child what book they are reading and who the main characters are.



This week as mathematicians we have been taking away by finding the difference. As authors we have been learning about reports by reading about the seasons and looking at the features of these texts .In PHSE we focussed on ourselves and what makes us unique. Ask your child to tell you about it! At home, please read every day. Practise counting to 50.

# Year 2

Year 2 learnt all about 2D shapes this week when being Mathematicians. In English the children have been very creative, coming up with their Traction Man sequels that they will write next week. We have also been Scientists, testing materials and finding out about their properties. At home, go on times tables rock stars garage mode to improve your times tables speed! And, read every night!



Year 4 really impressed their teachers this week with their creative skills. They started learning their performance songs, managed a no- script rehearsal and created some beautiful pottery in our Artist session. At home, practise your lines for the performance! Rehearse in front of your family and/or a mirror. Remember, not everyone knows the story so PLEASE practice speaking slowly and clearly.



It was SRE week this week and we were really impressed with the maturity shown in Year 6. As authors, the children wrote letters from Feo (the main character in our book Wolf Wilder) to her mother. As mathematicians, we learnt how to find percentages of amounts, for example 35% of 600 = 210! At home, ask your child what they learnt in SRE week this week.
