Reception

An exciting and different week in Reception! We were great mathematicians - finding out about doubles, counting in 2s and looking at patterns. As readers and writers we learnt to read and write longer words and sentences. At home please make physical patterns such as nod your head and clap your hands. Read your reading book at least three times with an adult and enjoy your story book together.

This week we completed a range of different assessments. We enjoyed reading and writing and completing special maths booklets. We have been busy learning our performance and cannot wait to be on stage! Please read every day at home. Practise counting forwards and backwards to 20.

Year 2

This week we wrote our own version of Anna Hibiscus' Holiday. We learned how to write Holiday postcards and wrote in role as Anna. In maths we focussed on subtracting two, 2-digit numbers. At home, read as often as possible with your child and ask questions about what they are reading. Practise number bonds within 20.

Year 3

This week Year 3 looked at problem solving mass in maths and wrote The Great Kapok Tree from a different perspective. We also had a fabulous celebration with Turner and Townsend.

Please continue to learn the 3, 4 and 8 times tables. Please continue to encourage your child to read every day in a fluent voice.

Year 4

This week children completed their own graphic novel sequel of The City of Ember! We also learned about shapes and their properties. We spent time with our new teachers in our new classrooms too - what a busy week! At home, read as often as possible with your child and ask them questions about what they are reading.

Year 5

This week children learned all about two famous artists who took inspiration from bird and insect nests. They then created their own clay nests. As Authors, they debated whether Varmints should accept their fate or not. As mathematicians, the children revised their multiples, factors and prime number learning. At home you can help by asking your child to tell you all about their sculpture.

This week children have been artists, studying and using Polish, Russian and Roman art. We went to IntoUniversity to get ready for secondary school. Most children have also taken part in SRE lessons and everyone has been learning lines and practising songs ready for our performance next week. .
