This week's learning ...



RecePtion

Reception have had a busy week! We made and tasted porridge to help Goldilocks and loved writing messages to our friends in our new message centre! In maths we learnt about 1 and 2 and practised our 'robot arms' in phonics. At home watch 'numberblocks' and practise using your 'robot arms'. Links will be on Tapestry.

Year3

This week we practised our shadow puppet performance of Rama and Sita. We did a fantastic job and you will be able to watch the performance on the class blog over the weekend! As mathematicians we continued to use the column method to solve problems. Please read with your child every day and practise the 2, 5,3 and 4 times tables.

Year 5 were busy this week creating different types of art inspired by celebrities Nadine Coyle and Tilly Lockley. We enjoyed papier-mache, oil pastels, paint and collage. Have a look on twitter to see our masterpieces! In maths we solved challenging problems using bar models, and in English we did lots of work around grammar. Please practise the spelling list in your homework. Remember to bring it back on Monday!

Year 5

We learnt about Princess Campbell this week and how she helped the Bristol community. We also learnt about the Japanese artist Yoyoi Kusama. We created our own art inspired by her work. This week we also used the part-part-whole model in our addition work and learnt how to use the Bar Model. Help at home by practising writing numbers with your child. Some of us find writing numbers '3', '5', and '8' tricky.

Year 2

This week we have been busy rehearing for our performance! We have been adding and subtracting tens and ones in maths and are writing letters to our partner classes in English.

Please read with your child at home and practise lines for our performance next week. You could also ask your child to write a letter to a friend using the features of letter writing!

We wrote amazing sequels to Frogspell this week! Miss Skinner and Miss Goldsack are so impressed! As mathematicians, we added four digit numbers with exchanges. We were also historians and learnt about Anglo-Saxons invading Britain. Support your child's learning by reading with your child and encouraging them to practise times tables.

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Year 6 wrote excellent mystery stories this week which they will record to send to their buddies in Year 3. In maths we multiplied 4 digit by 2 digit numbers and began to use written division. We spent the week creating wire sculptures or beetles which we will complete next week. At home, please practise written multiplication and addition.


