

# What have we learnt this week?

**Reception classes** ... This week we worked together outside to make a huge den using sticks, rope and material. We had to problem-solve about how to keep the material off the floor. In maths we thought of number sentences to solve maths problems. At home, please finish creating your Interactive Learning Diary login (see reception teachers if you need help). Have a look at your child's diary with your child. Have a go at uploading a picture onto your child's profile to share something they are learning.

Year 1 ... This week the children wrote their own instructions. In maths we measured using a ruler and ordered objects according to their weight. We were also busy learning a range of new class songs that we will perform during our Year 1 performance. Please ensure your child is reading regularly (every day!) at home.

Year 2... This week children wrote their own information texts about a monster. In maths they learned about bar charts and pictograms. In topic they planned and carried out an experiment to find out where cress seeds grow best. At home, please practise telling the time with your child – we will be learning this next week.

**Year 3** ... This week we practised finding equivalent fractions. We also wrote our own discussion texts. We also learned some more about the rainforest in Topic. You can help at home by asking your child about what they have learned about the Rainforest in Topic this week.

Year 4 ... This week we wrote our own persuasive texts, using everything we have learned over the last few weeks. In Maths, we worked on finding amounts of money and converting between pence and pounds. In topic, we carried out scientific experiments to find out about condensation and precipitation. Please support your child by ensuring they are reading regularly (every day!) at home.

Year 5... This week the children innovated their own discussion text about 'should children go to school?' They revised skills of comparing fractions, adding and subtracting fractions and explaining their reasoning. In Topic we learned all about the journey of rivers and the language linked to volcanoes and earthquakes. You can help at home by supporting your child to practise their times tables. They should be able to recall them instantly!

Year 6 ... This week, we learnt about the properties of angles. We used these facts to solve challenging 'missing angle' problems. In literacy, we wrote stories that involved a secret hiding place and worked hard to include semi-colons and fronted adverbials. We loved the visit from Google on Monday where we went on an expedition through the great barrier reef, landing on the moon and through the circulatory system. Please talk to your child about our Google visit. Please support your child to practise their times tables. They should be able to recall them instantly!
