Year 2 Year 2 had a busy week. We were philosophers on Monday, looking at how different religions view the world. We were also scientists changing materials -and as authors we created persuasive posters! Please read with your child five times a week. Practise your 2, 5 and 10 times table including doing them out of order.

This week as authors the children have written some fantastic descriptions of their own hero. As mathematicians we started to explore money. We also enjoyed learning about keeping calm and finding ways we can deal with our different emotions. Please make sure your child is reading five times a week on Bug Club. Let us know if you need help logging in.

Year 3

Year 4 This week Year 4 were busy learning the script and practising songs for our performance at the end of term. As mathematicians we used the column method to multiply numbers. As authors we showed excellent presentation skills in writing up our newspaper reports. At home please practise multiplication and weekly spellings.

Year 5 have been busy as ever. Our drama expert Carlota came in and taught us about gravity (we acted out the famous apple-on-head scene as Isaac Newton). As mathematicians we added, subtracted and converted fractions. Our teachers were blown away with our sensational descriptive writing about our different characters. Please practise your multiplication tables and weekly spellings.

Year 6 continued to read Floodlands in class - we are really enjoying it. We wrote persuasive speeches about climate change inspired by Greta Thunberg. In maths we successfully converted between decimals and fractions. Our RESPECT focus this week is around being respectful to all adults in school. We have been able to give out several house points to children who have demonstrated this well. Please reinforce the message of RESPECT at home as much as possible.

School Uniform

Please remember all children need to come to school in correct school uniform

- Navy blue cardigan, sweatshirt or fleece - preferably with school logo
- Plain white shirt, blouse or polo shirt
- Black or dark grey trousers - not denim
- Black or dark grey knee length skirt or pinafore dress
- Headscarves or hijabs, if worn, must be navy blue or white
- Black, sensible shoes - football boots, flip flops or heels are not acceptable for school



If your child has PE first thing in the morning, they can come to school in their PE kit. If they have PE in the afternoon, they must come to school in regular school uniform. During PE, hijabs and headscarves should be tucked in.
