What have we been learning?

Reception

We have been working hard to learn how to behave in a gold standard way in and around school and had fun getting to know all of our new class mates! Parents, next week we will be focussing on families. Please bring in a photo of your family so we can talk to the children about it, maybe of special occasion that they can tell us all about.

Year 2

We have started to explore a new book, 'Traction Man'. We created brilliant performances using props from the story. We also started a new enquiry called 'What could my school be made of?' and started to investigate the properties of different materials. At home, ask your child about their 'Traction Man' story and ask about any new words they've learnt.

Year 4

We have started our new enquiry where we will investigate 'What is the difference between noise and sound?'. To support this enquiry we started exploring the book 'Ossiri and the Bala Mengro'. We used the text to write non-chronological reports about travellers! At home, please read with your children and help them to practise their times tables.

Year 1

This week Year 1 have started reading a new book called 'The Magic Hat.' We have been writing predictions and retelling the story with actions! At home, read with your child and ask them to retell the story 'The Magic Hat' to you.

Year 3

This week Year 3 have started to read a new story in literacy called Arthur and the Golden Rope. We have also started a new enquiry called 'How do we find out about the past?' and looked at artefacts from different times and places. At home, please read with your child and support your child with their homework over the weekend and make sure they bring it in on Monday.

Year 5

We had a visit from the 'Explorer Dome' this week which took us on a trip to space to launch our first enquiry as Scientists! We also began reading our novel: 'Cosmic' and we wrote descriptions of the main character 'Liam'. In maths, we looked at place value including rounding, Roman numerals and partitioning numbers into tens of thousands, thousands, hundreds, tens and ones. Ask your child to tell you about how our novel links with our enquiry.

Year 6

We started the week with some practice SATs papers which the children worked very hard through. Our book this term is Beetle Boy, so Year 6 have started to read this, acting out some scenes and interpreting the new vocabulary. In maths we discovered the concept of millions and have been understanding numbers up to 10 million using place value counters and other methods. At home, make sure your child gets into the habit of reading for 15 minutes every night!
