News from the classes...

Reception classes ... In Literacy this week we have invented our own stories. We learnt about story structure and how to make our story exciting to the reader. In Maths we learnt about patterns and how to make a repeating pattern. Please help at home by creating natterns with household objects for example 'fork, spoon, fork, spoon'.

Year 1 ... We finished the week with a fantastic trip to the zoo! This supports our class topic where we have been learning all about animals. Thank you to the parents who came along nd helped! Please ask your child all about today's trip. Please continue to support your child by counting and writing numbers 50-200 (forwards and backwards).

Year 2 ... In Literacy this week we wrote our own stories based on the book 'How to Catch a Star'. We changed the character, the object and the setting and added in describing words. In 🔌 Numeracy we found fractions of numbers and shapes and counted on in halves and guarters. We also discussed how people care for us and what we need in order to be fit and healthy. At home, please ask your child about this week's learning.

Year 3 ... In Maths this week we compared and ordered fractions. We learnt how to add and subtract fractions as well. In Literacy we thought of ideas to innovate our class text including some lovely ideas for new rooms that could be found in the chocolate factory. In topic, we learned about light sources and then created our own circuits. Please help at home by National discussing this week's learning with your child.

Year 4... This week we worked on our fantasy story 'Leon and the Place Between'. We used prepositional phrases, onomatopoeia, expanded non phrases and Power of Three to make sure our writing had a big impact on the reader. In Numeracy we explored fractions and decimals, representing numbers in different ways and making links with division. We also 🔪 made a fantastic dance about the digestive system - if you quiz us on the different organs nd functions of the digestive system we'll know all the answers! At home please ask your nild to explain what a fraction is and how we can find equivalents with decimal numbers.

Year 5... In numeracy this week we have found fractions and then applied this learning to word problems. In literacy we explored how to create tension in our writing and practised using different techniques. In SRE we discussed physical and emotional changes that take place as people grow older. At home please talk to your child about all the SRE learning 🔌 we have done this week.

Year 6...Year 6 have risen to the challenge in tests, reviewing their learning so far this year. They have also planned a playscript in Literacy and practised dividing fractions and solving problems. They have also displayed a mature, sensible attitude to their SRE lessons this week. At home, please ask your child what they have learnt in SRE. S S
