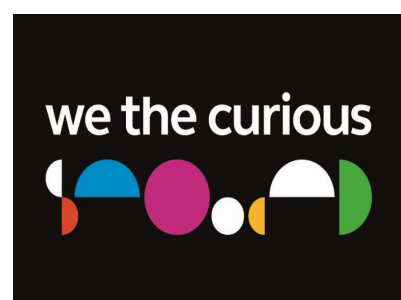

What have we been learning?

Reception.... We started learning our new story 'The Little Red Hen' this week. In Maths, we counted how many eggs the hen had laid and practised finding 'one more' and 'one less than' numbers up to 20. At home, practise all the sounds we have learnt so far using the sound card in your book bag. Say a sound. Ask your child to point to it or write it as quickly as they can. Please keep reading books and put them in the box to be changed regularly (at least once or twice a week).

Year 2... in English we started our new book The Tin Forest. We created our own Tin Forests and predicted what the book may be about. We also started a new enquiry 'What grows in my city?' and drew cross-sections of fruit and vegetables. At home, read with your child every day. Practise adding, subtraction, division and multiplication.

Year 4... we started a brand new text- 'The city of Ember', which is a graphic novel. We have really enjoyed exploring it so far. We also started our new Enquiry, which is all about electricity. We did an electricity hunt around the school and found out how much we spend every month on electricity (lots!) At home help your child to practise telling the time to 5 minutes.

Year 6... This week we recapped our knowledge on answering word problems, converting between different units of measure and the four fraction operations. As authors, we researched graffiti in preparation for writing a report. At home, support your child with their homework and ensure that they continue to read every night.

Year 1... English we started our new book 'The Last Tree'. In guided reading, we thought about what might happen in a story and made our own predictions. In Enquiry we really enjoyed being artists and sketched a variety of different plants. At home, look at the world around you... what plants and trees can you identify in your local area?

Year 3... as mathematicians we have consolidated our knowledge of time and as readers and writers we started a new book called 'Oliver and the Seawigs'. Ask your child what has happened so far! At home, ask your child to tell you the time! Encourage them to read as often as possible and ask them questions about book.

Year 5... In maths, we started learning all about position and direction using mirrors and coordinates. In English, we are enjoying poems from 'Carnival of the Animals' by listening to and interpreting music that represents different carnival animals. We have also started learning all about samba music this week! At home, please support your child by working on your child's homework with them and ensuring they continue to read every night.
