What have we been learning?

Reception.... We welcomed some of our new children visiting us this week. We were very kind and helpful, showing our openness and nurture values well. We also visited year one and we are excited about our new classes for September. Our caterpillars have turned into chrysalises and we are watching closely to see the butterflies emerge! At home, talk to your child about how they feel about moving on to year one and discuss any questions they have. Watch 'Counting in 2s' song on you tube!

Year 2...we looked at 'hundreds' numbers for the first time and had a go adding and subtracting them. As writers we began to create our own non-chronological report about a country in Africa. At home, please continue to read with your child every day. Please practise times tables with your child too!

Year 4... have had a very successful test week! The children showed endurance and perseverance and should be very proud of themselves! We also began auditioning for Hannah More's Got Talent - so start practising your acts at home! At home, practise times tables and related division facts.

Year 1... this week we planned a nonchronological report about The Lonely Beast. We have been telling the time and writing different times in Maths. In Enquiry we made special moving pictures that we enjoyed sharing with the reception children. At home, help your child to count forwards and backwards in 2s, 5s and 10s.

Year 3... as authors we have been practising our persuasive writing. As mathematicians we have learnt about the properties of different shapes. As well as this, children worked really hard on some tests this week — we are very proud of them! At home, read with your child every night and help them to practise their times tables.

Year 5... have battled through Year 6 SATs papers. They managed to do their level best in reading, grammar and maths tests. They began looking at the works of Naturalists and Behavioural scientists. As part of our enquiry, we also went on a nature trail noticing and predicting which animals would live in different habitats on the way. The children were really appreciative of the peace and calm of places like Snuff Mills. . At home, encourage your child to talk about the different habitats around your area and home.

Year 6... we practised our performance and learned our lines this week We also welcomed visitors from Metro Bank who taught us about finances. Yesterday, we went on an exciting story-telling trip to Blaise Castle! At home, please help your child to look after their new plant!
