# What have we learnt this week?

## Reception



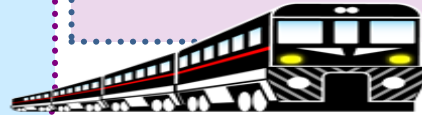
We enjoyed learning about Minibeasts this week. We went on a minibeast hunt and used books, computers and ipads to find out more. We wrote sentences about different minibeasts and had fun creating patterns, measuring and describing shapes on our maths day. At home, please play the 'describing shapes game'! Find shapes at home and ask your child to hide one behind their back and describe it to you. eg. It has 3 corners and 3 sides... Can you guess what shape it is?

## Year 1

In literacy we joined sentences using the words 'and', 'so' and 'because'. In numeracy we learnt number bonds to 10 and 20. We really enjoyed learning about John Cabot as part of local history week. At home, please ask your child to tell you facts about John Cabot.

## Year 2

This week we studied place value, recognising the value of each digit in numbers to 100. We enjoyed learning about Brunel's design of Temple Meads station, how trains have changed over time and their importance. We loved our open top bus tour of Bristol where we learned more about Brunel. At home, ask your child to tell you facts about trains.



## Year 3

This week we enjoyed learning about why chocolate is important in Bristol's history. We also practised using mathematical vocabulary related to measures, and wrote recounts about our great trip. At home, please ask your child what they learnt on our trip to M-shed.

## Year 5

In Numeracy this week we multiplied and divided by powers of 10 to convert units of measure. In Literacy, we started reading our new book 'Frogspell' and created potions for our WOW event! From this, we created poems using personification and rhyming words. We enjoyed our local history topic and have learnt Bristol buildings have changed. You can help your child by supporting them with multiplying and dividing by 10/100/1000.



## Year 4

This week we learnt about George Muller and his work for children in Bristol. We wrote fantastic biographies about him! We welcomed a visitor who explained about life in the orphanages. We also had a fantastic scouts taster session! In maths, we learned about coordinates. Please help at home by encouraging your child to complete the sumdog challenge.



## Year 6

This week we solved unequal grouping and sharing problems using the bar method. We enjoyed local history week, especially a really informative walk with Michael Gorely on Tuesday. We searched high and low for evidence of the Blitz around Bristol. This linked to our literacy where we imagined we were going to be evacuated from Bristol and wrote letters to a family we were being evacuated to. At home, ask your child about the Blitz, and especially what happened in Bristol.
