Happy New Year to all of our school community. I hope that you enjoyed a restful break and the new year has started well.

Despite the pouring rain, I was brightened up by the number of smiling faces that came through the gate on Wednesday. Many children told me how happy they were to be back in school. School should be enjoyable and learning new things is good for all of us, whatever our age. It has been lovely to see children reconnecting with friends and enjoying time in class with their adults.



Attendance

School starts at 8.45am. Although the register doesn't close until 9 o'clock, learning starts at 8.45am. The start of the day is often the time when children practise key skills for their year group or go over areas that they might have misunderstood from the previous day. If children arrive at 9am or later, they could miss an hour of learning a week.

1 hour each week = 1 day each term.

During the learning review meetings, teachers will talk to you about attendance. Anything above 95% is good attendance. Many of our children are below this number. As with lateness, if children aren't in school, they can't learn. I know how much our community values education and can see how much of a difference it can make. Everyone gets ill sometimes and that cannot be helped. Please think carefully about whether to keep children at home. Lost learning time can make a big difference to academic achievement.

Homework club

Homework club starts in week three on Thursday 18th January. Adults must come with children. It is a chance for children to spend focused time on their homework. Also, it can be a good chance for adults to see how they can help their children at home. The club will run for Year 1 and 2 in BFG class and Year 3 – 6 in Owl class with Mr Cook.

I hope that as we start 2024, we can continue to build on the work that we have done in 2023. Everyone at Hannah More wants the best for the children and the community. If we continue to work together, we can achieve this. Have a good weekend.

CLASS NEWS

We had a wonderful start to the term. As authors, we wrote the beginning of the story 'Owl Babies'. In phonics, we revisited the ue and u-e digraphs (two letters that make one sound) and as mathematicians we thought about shape and repeated patters. At home you can help your child learn to read and write the tricky words sent home last term.

This week Year 2 started work on our new book 'Pattan's Pumpkin'. We also learnt about 3D shapes and their properties. We started to learn about seeds and plants, and enjoyed a trip to the Old Vic to watch a performance called 'Four Seasons'. Please read with your child 5 times a week. Practise your 2, 5 and 10 times table including doing them out of order.

This week we started our new termly book. We wrote predictions about our story. In enquiry we started a new topic which looks at the Vikings. We explored the timeline of British history and learnt new vocabulary. Please read with your child 3 times a week at home. Please make sure your child does the homework sheet.

A super first week back in Year 4. As authors, we started to explore a new book called 'The Iron Man' by Ted Hughes. We discovered that this iron robot is bigger than a house and has a head as big as a bedroom. We used this information to create our own similes for his facial features and we tried to use a mysterious tone. As mathematicians, we continued to work on our 3-digit by 1-digit formal multiplications written methods. Please read with your child at least 3 times a week. Practise your 6 and 8 times table including doing them out of order.

Since being back, we have travelled to the stars as we began our space-themed enquiry 'What makes our planet unique?'. In our maths lessons we explored the concept of perimeter and calculating it in shapes. As authors we began reading our new book 'Cosmic' and reviewed non-chronological reports ahead of planetary research next week. At home, share knowledge of and use the internet to research the different planets of the solar system.

A short but busy first week back for Year 6! We began our next text for the term 'Floodland' - a story all about how sea level rises affect the UK. We also multiplied and divided fractions and learnt about renewable energy! At home please ensure your child reads at least 3 times a week for 18 minutes.

mixed group with tutor Mark


Tuesday evenings @ 6:30-1:30
