What have we been learning?

Reception... This week we began to learn to use our whiteboards and pens and become independent with our learning. We enjoyed hearing all about the adventures that our class teddy bears have been on with you! Next week is our LSA Charlotte's last week in Caterpillar Class before she heads off to go on maternity leave so we will make sure she has lots of fun with us!

Year 2... this week we planned and wrote an adventure story about our own superhero character. We also explored a new book as readers - The Three Javelinas! As mathematicians we compared numbers. Help your child at home by practising to write numbers up to 100.

Year 4... This week we read the book 'Horrible Science Sounds Dreadful', from which we learnt lots of information about how sound travels to our ear drums. We also had a go at body percussion and did some in-class performances! At home, make sure your child reads out loud to you for 20 minutes each night.

Year 6 ... This week in maths we explored negative numbers by going down to the beach first! In English we were newspaper reporters, writing our own report of Darkus' dad's disappearance from the book Beetle Boy. In enquiry, we discussed our inherited and environmental characteristics. At home, please look at a newspaper together with your child and ask them to point out all the features.

Year 1... this week we learnt about the properties of materials and experimented with them. In maths, we compared numbers using the words **less than, greater than and equal to**. In English, we learnt how to write a **proper sentence**! Please read with your child at home every day. Make sure homework is completed and handed in on Monday.

Year 3... In writing, our Authors were busy producing poems about cats. In maths we deepened our understanding of place value. In Enquiry we were busy understanding timelines and how football kits have changed over time! Please read with your child at home and support them with their homework over the weekend - and remind them to bring it to school on Monday.

Year 5... This week we learned about the history of space in our Enquiry lessons. In maths, we explored negative numbers and practised rounding, comparing and ordering numbers to a million. In English, we wrote persuasive adverts for people to visit our theme park! Please encourage your child to practise their joined up handwriting.
