
Respect

CLASS NENS

YEAR 1 Our songs and costumes are really coming along ready for the performance. As authors, we wrote stories set under the ocean and looked at rhyming words. As mathematicians, we continued learning to add and subtract using first, then and now stories to help us and we solved missing number equations. Please help your child learn their lines for the performance.

This week Year 2 delved deeper into our book 'Zeraffa Giraffa'. The children wrote their own journey story and thought about their presentation. In maths, we compared mass. We also studied Brunel and his achievements, and enjoyed learning facts about the famous engineer. Please practise the 2, 5 and 10 times tables. Read every day and ask questions about the book.

SEAR 3 This week we focused on fractions, we were able to identify the numerator and denominator and write our own fractions. We spent a lot of time being historians and thought about why Romans were so successful, as well as looking at what they invented. Please read with your child at least <u>3 times a week and ask them questions about their reading</u>. Please complete the homework sheet.

Year 4 worked really hard on their maths and reading assessments this week. The teachers were impressed with their focus and resilience, even when the questions got tricky. As scientists, we investigated how volume levels are recorded when you increase distance from the source of the sound. We also studied the poem 'Football Mad' for World Book Day, and made monster bookmarks. At home, put each spelling word into a sentence that makes sense in your homework book. Please read with your child at least <u>3 times a week</u>. Practise your 7 times tables including division facts and doing them out of order.

VEAR 5 We were busy reviewing and testing our learning this week. In maths, we checked how well we've done so far and built a plan for the last third of the year. As authors, we wrote our own endings to a story from The Explorer, while as scientists we explored and investigated soluble and insoluble materials. At home, share with children some special journeys that you have been on, and discuss those which they would like to take themselves.

Year 6 worked hard doing SATs mocks this week in preparation for Term 5. They also learnt about Benjamin Zephaniah as part of our World Book Day poet study. At home, practise SATs style questions.
