Thursday — 'est' suffix

Adding —est to adjectives means 'most' and is used to compare. Normally you just add —est straight

to the adjective but there are some exceptions.

If the adjective already ends in e, then just add st

Example: rude \rightarrow rudest

When the adjective ends in y, change it to i, and add $\underset{\mbox{\scriptsize est}}{\mbox{\scriptsize est}}$

Example: crazy \rightarrow craziest

If the adjective has a short vowel sound (a, o, i, e, u) followed by one consonant, double the last consonant then add est.

Example: thin \rightarrow thinnest

Add the suffix 'est' to these adjectives using the rules.
