The prefix 'mis' is added on the front of words and gives them an extra meaning.
'Mis' on the front of a word means wrong.

Example: Mis + hear = mishear

Mishear means that you haven't heard somebody right.



1. Can you follow the clues and spell the words. They all use the prefix 'mis'.

Clue 1: When you read something wrong → m i s _ _ _ _ _

Clue 2: When you spell something wrong → m i s _ _ _ _ _

Clue 5: When something is in the wrong place and you can't find it → _ _ _ _ _

'Dis' on the front of a word means not.

Example: Dis + allow = Disallow

Disallow means that you are not allowed to do something.
