

1. Can you fill in the blanks?

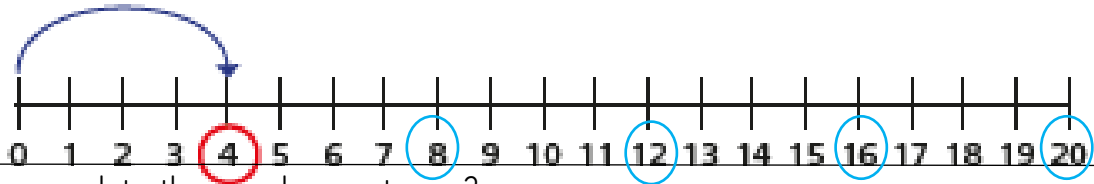

There are 6 equal groups of 4.

$$4 + 4 + 4 + 4 + 4 + 4 = 24$$

2. Can you circle all numbers in the 4 times table?



3. Can you complete the number sentences?

a)  $2 \times 4 = 8$

$6 \times 4 = 24$

$4 \times 12 = 48$

$4 \times 4 = 16$

$4 \times 3 = 12$

$0 \times 4 = 0$

$8 \times 4 = 32$

$28 = 7 \times 4$

$4 \times 9 = 36$

4. Ali had 8 boxes with 4 toy cars in each box.

His brother then gave him 2 more cars. How many cars does he have now?



2 step question!

$8 \times 4 = 32$

$32 + 2 = 34$

34 cars

5. A baker needs 20 cakes for a party.

He has 6 boxes of cakes and in each box there are 4 cakes.

I don't think he has enough cakes.

Do you agree? Why/ why not? I disagree because  $6 \times 4 = 24$  and 24 is more than 20.



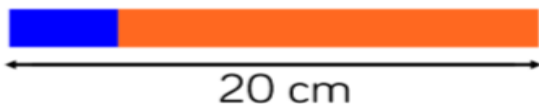
Here is a blue strip of paper.



An orange strip is four times as long.



The strips are joined end to end.



*This one was especially tricky!*

How long is the blue strip? 4 cm. The orange strip is 4 times as long —  $4 \times 4 = 16$

How long is the orange strip? 16 cm

Can you create your own question similar to this?

A bottle contains 4 litres of juice.

Stella needs 30 litres of juice for a party.

She has 12 bottles.

Does she have enough juice? How do you know?

*I think she does have enough juice because  $4 \times 12 = 48$  which is more than 30.*
