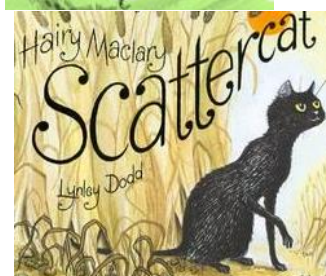


Thursday 11th June - English

When writing in rhyme, it's a good idea to make a list of pairs of rhyming words that could go at the end of the lines before you start.
