3. Change the word in **bold** for an antonym (a word that means the opposite).

Here are some suggestions but you could have other words too.

- a) The skeletons were **kind**. *unkind, horrible*
- b) The big skeleton **scared** the little skeleton. *reassured, calmed*
- c) "That's a **good** idea," exclaimed the little skeleton. *bad, terrible*
- d) The skeletons **put the dog together**. *took the dog apart*
- e) The skeleton animals were so **noisy**. *quiet, silent, calm*

Challenge

Write two new versions of this text.

One night the big skeleton sat up in bed. He scratched his skull. "What shall we do tonight?" he said. "Let's take the dog for a walk," said the little skeleton. "And frighten somebody!" "Good idea!" the big skeleton said.

The first versions should use synonyms for as many words as you can, so that it is very similar but not the same.

The second version should use antonyms for as many words as you can, so that it is the opposite of the original text.
