HELP DESK



Similes: describe something by comparing it to something else, using 'like' or 'as' *E.g. 'The statue was cold as ice'*

Metaphors: a word or a phrase used to describe something as if it were something else. *E.g. 'He was a tornado'*

Personification:

Describing objects as if they are people *E.g. 'The statue stared out across the water'*

Hyperbole: words used to *exaggerate*, *intensify* and *emphasise* different ideas *E.g. 'The pizza was hotter than the sun.'*

Alliteration:

Repeating the sounds at the start of words *E.g 'The solid, silver statue'*

Onomatopoeia:

Words that sound like what they describe *E.g. 'plop' or 'bang'*
